Subject: CONSIDER AND ACT: Transfer of Fund Balances to Utilities Capital

Projects Fund (Fund 42) – "Mile-Per-Year" Program

Background:

The City's Mile-Per-Year program is a long-term capital improvement initiative to replace approximately one mile of aging water and sewer infrastructure each year. To ensure the program's continued funding, staff included increased contributions to the Utilities Capital Projects Fund (Fund 42) in the Fiscal Year 2026 budget.

City Council adopted a funding plan that increases annual contributions from both the Water & Sewer Fund (Fund 02) and the General Fund (Fund 01) by \$1,000,000 each. The increase is phased in over four years: Year 1 provides \$250,000 from operations and \$750,000 from fund balance, with operational contributions increasing by \$250,000 annually until the full \$1,000,000 is supported entirely from operations.

This phased approach provides immediate resources to Fund 42 while gradually aligning operational contributions with the full program cost, ensuring the Mile-Per-Year program remains fully funded, supports infrastructure reliability, and preserves the City's financial flexibility.
